

# Kentucky Good Sam Rules for Birdie Yard Golf



Yard golf game  
played like cornhole

## Rules of Play

*Big Birdie Yard Golf™ (BBYG)* can be played with 1 to 4 players. A team consists of 2 players. Teammates stand at opposite net pits. Points are awarded based on which ring or square a (BBYG) ball lands in:

Outermost Ring = 1 pt  
Middle Ring = 2 pts  
Inner Ring = 3 pts

Only one team can score per round.

Begin a round with one player from each team at the same net pit. Each player hits all 3 of their (BBYG) balls in a row.

If Yellow goes first, hit all 3 yellow (BBYG) balls. White then hits all 3 white (BBYG) balls.

Cancellation scoring may be easily calculated as follows:

The points of both players are added. The points of the lowest scoring player are subtracted from the points of the highest scoring player. The result is a score for the highest scoring player. The score for the lowest scoring player would be zero.

The golf ball of a (BBYG) ball must pass completely through a square in the net to receive any points. "Bounce-ins" count.

After points are awarded, it's your teammate's turn. They repeat the above.

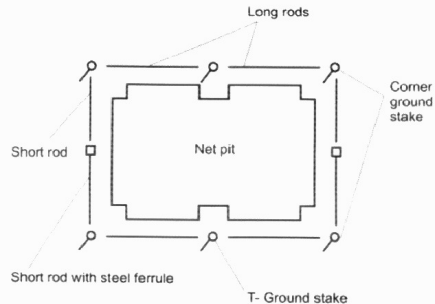
The team which scored previously goes first.

Games are played to 15 or 21 points and must be won by 2 points or more.

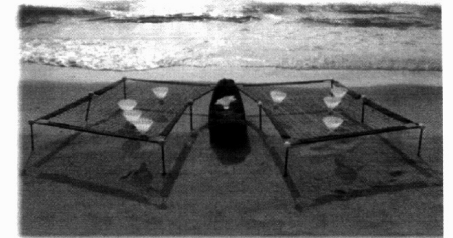
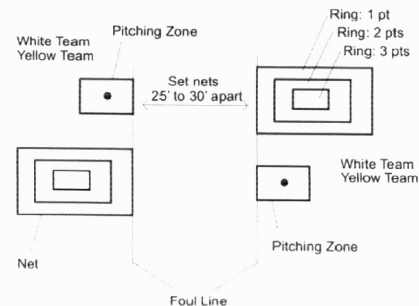
*Big Birdie Yard Golf™* sets up on grass, the beach and even cement!

### Net Setup

Each net uses 4 long rods and 4 short rods. 2 of the short rods have aluminum ferrules. Slide all rods through black sleeves on netting as pictured below. Connect all four corner golf ball ground stakes first then attach the T-ground stakes last.



Offset each net pit as pictured below. Place net pits 25' to 30' feet apart based on skill level.
